

HYDRO CEMETERY

The Hydro Cemetery was located SW4SE4, SE4SE4 of Sec 29, T37N, R20E. The first gate you enter is south of the Abraham Loewen place which is now owned by Brad Tilleman. There is a second gate going east and right after that gate, if you follow the fence line north - carefully not to drive in a hole or get stuck in the bottom - then up the bank to another gate which opens to the west, driving through it and turn immediately driving through another gate and this will put you into the area of the Hydro Cemetery with piped fencing. James Warburton fenced the graves visible at the Hydro Cemetery in Oct 1997.

DALKE FAMILY PLOT

The Dalke Family Plot is located east and north of the Hydro Cemetery. Returning to the second gate, continue on the road or trail east and then follow the trail north to SE4NE4 of Sec 29, T37N, R20E. The two Dalke graves have a cement cover and the area is fenced by pipe and rod, built by James Warburton under the direction of The Milk River Genealogy Society member, Karen Jellum, 1997. Grandson Edward, his wife Beverly and son, Mark, painted the pipe fence white and put up a white cross.

NAZARENE CHURCH

Maria Lowen, wife of Abraham Lowen, tells in her story in the *Unyielding Prairie*, that her husband gave three acres in SE4NW4 of NW4 T37N, R20E, and that he started building the Nazarene Church in the spring of 1915. In 1961, the church was given to Chinook by Lowens and moved some 30 miles to become the Nazarene Church there.

John and Lena Mandtler adopted a three week old boy in June 1917 and he died Friday, Sept 28 1917. Ann Schroeder says the baby was buried near the Nazarene Church at Hydro.
